3A HSIE EXCURSION TO WOLLONGONG—Tuesday 2 April 2024

On Tuesday 2nd of April, 3A went on an excursion to BlueScope Steel: Inside Industry tour to support their learning in Commerce. We left Bankstown Station and made our way to BlueScope Steel in Coniston, 1 hour away.

We arrived at the steel factory and met the guides Margaret and John. John worked at the factory for 40 years and had a lot of knowledge to share with us. The tour showed us the entire process of making steel in the factory and all the working areas. We were given full personal protective equipment including a hard hat, gloves, glasses, and jacket. The guides also gave everyone a handset with headphones. John explained the process, temperatures, equipment, and value of the factory for Australia. We all enjoyed seeing the hot steel travel through different machines to be made thinner and thinner then rolled into large coils. These coils of steel cost between \$40 000 and \$70 000 each. We climbed high above the machines and felt the heat of the red-hot steel as it was being cut into shape, the smell was terrible!

We also learned about the excellent recycling that is happening at the factory. Steel off cuts are collected and used again and again. The company also recycles water and 80% of the water on site comes from a plant rather than the dam.

It was a great day together.
