Overall, this was a wonderful day of learning experiences.








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### INTERVIEW WITH OUR COMMUNITY VOLUNTEER, Ms Lorraine Manning





What is your name? My name is Lorraine Manning.

# Tell us a bit about yourself e.g. where were you born, what languages can you speak, what do you like doing in your free time etc.

I was born in Sydney. My Mother was Australian and my father was an immigrant from England (he arrived here in 1911 and never went back). I speak English but learnt French, German and Latin at school. I learnt some Italian before a holiday in Italy. In my spare time I knit, quilt and go to the gym.

#### How long have you been working as a Community Volunteer?

I started to volunteer after I retired from teaching high school Maths in 2010. I helped Sudanese refugees with their homework, then Syrian refugees in a private high school in Granville and then to come to Bankstown.

#### What did you do before becoming a Community Volunteer?

Before becoming a volunteer, I had two careers. I firstly got a Science degree from University and I got a scholarship after that to become a librarian at our State Library. Five years later, I had my two daughters and resumed my library career. In 1985 I decided to become a teacher of Maths. More University studies to gain the appropriate qualifications.

# When did you start working at Bankstown Intensive English Centre (BIEC) and how did you find out about this school?


I started at Bankstown IEC in 2022 because an old school friend volunteered here and she said it was a great place.
